The First step to Divorce in Maryland (MD)

After long-time thinking of breaking family relationships, at last, you decided to separate. Divorce is not a simple decision, in many cases, it's a forced step. If the couple lives in Maryland, a divorce should be filed at the place of residence under this state law.

A little of Divorce theory

Based-on-fault and without fault divorces are legal in Maryland.

In the first case, the grounds of marriage split should be given. Among the State's recognized divorce reasons are cruelty, excessively vicious conduct toward a minor child of the plaintiff or the party itself, adultery, a felony conviction, deliberate desertion for 12 months, and insanity.

Acceptable grounds for without fault separation:

- Mutual Consent - the couple has no underage children, all issues of marital support, possessions, and outstanding payments have been cohered and the husband and wife are present at the final court hearing;
- A year separation - if a couple has resided apart, without concubinage for 12 months without a breach of this period of continuity before applying for divorce.

You Do need to provide one of two above-listed proofs for the no-fault divorce in MD, otherwise, you will have to appeal a fault-based divorce.

There are two divorce types in MD: an “absolute” and a “limited”. Each type takes into consideration the same issues such as child alimony, child custody, and property division.

The limited divorce is also called “legal separation”, which means the spouses stay legally married, but can live separately. It's required to live in Maryland for the first year after divorce.

Paperwork for Maryland (MD) Divorce

The “Complaint for Absolute Divorce” and the “Civil Domestic Case Information Report” are two general documents, which should be completed in any type of separation.

You need to surf the MD Courts website, and attentively choose forms, corresponding to your divorce circumstances, among the list of legal forms on the Family Law Forms page.

If you have any questions concerning the forms' selection or their correct fulfillment, you can get in touch with or attend the county clerk to be sure that you will apply due forms.

All submitted forms should be related to your specific case and all data should be properly indicated, otherwise, extra charges or delays may arise in your divorce process.

Divorce Documents' Submitting in Maryland

It is essential to sign any affidavits or applications only in the presence of a notary, who usually should work at most courts.

After filling all necessary divorce papers, they should be filed in requested copies' quantity to the county clerk of your family's current residence.

After paying the state filing fee, ensure that the clerk has accepted your divorce docs and stamped them. Then you will receive the next instructions.

How to notify the spouse about Divorce in MD

As the divorce is a both parts' deal, you should supply your partner with divorce papers' copies as well as a "Writ of Summons", and provide the evidence of this action in the court for a successful divorce final.

There are some permitted ways of serving the spouse in MD:

- By post - according to Maryland requirements the divorce docs should be sent by not the plaintiff in the divorce, but any other person. While receiving the documents the husband or wife should sign the receipt notification, which will be appropriate proof of divorce papers' delivery in the court;
- If you don't want to serve the mate in person, you can entrust this to other people, who are 18 or older, and not related to the divorce;
- County Sheriff can do this for an additional charge;
- The Private Process Server service will cost even higher than the sheriff's one, but the number of the spouse's notification attempts are not limited whereas the sheriff will take only one visit. Using this method, after successful papers' submission to the husband or wife, you will get the receipt, which should be filed to the court.

Having passed all these steps with the divorce documents, the only thing that you will need to do is to wait for freedom. The divorce finalization can take from one to three months.

If you are full of intention to separate, you shouldn't waste your time on complicated forms, it's more convenient to rely on CompleteCase.
