

## **The Two Sides of Walt Disney: Creative Genius and Troubled Tyrant**

Disney had racist and antisemitic sympathies. He socialized with extreme right-wing groups and anti-Communist crusaders in Hollywood. Some of his early cartoons contained racist tropes like blackface characters. He was also accused of discriminating against Jewish employees.

As his company grew, Disney became an authoritarian leader who demanded total control. He fired employees for petty reasons and closely managed every aspect of production. He created a toxic work culture of fear and favoritism.

When overworked animators on Snow White demanded compensation, Disney refused their requests and lied about profit sharing. They eventually went on strike in 1941, winning pay raises and overtime but alienating Disney. Many loyal employees left after the strike.

Disney's brother Roy said "Walt had no close friends, even within the family...Walt had two personalities. One for outside, one inside." Behind his charming public persona, he was a tyrant who created an culture of fear at his studios.

Yet his creativity reshaped entertainment and shaped childhoods for generations. Disney shows us that genius is often accompanied by deep flaws and dark sides. While we celebrate his vision, we must also acknowledge the destructive impact of his prejudices, authoritarianism and neglect of his workers' rights. The story of Walt Disney reveals both the heights and depths of the human condition.
